As part of our ongoing commitment to monitoring and evaluation and in order to provide information for inspection, all courses are subject to impact evaluation. Participants will be required to complete Evaluation Learning Level 1 forms at the end of each activity, with a representative sample receiving Level 2 (impact evaluation) forms at the three month stage. Line managers will be required to provide information at Level 2 to give an indication of the impact which training has had on quality of service delivery.

# Emotional Abuse and Neglect – 1 day

## Course objectives:

The course aims to explore definitions and indicators of emotion abuse, raise awareness of dynamics of child sexual abuse and the impact of this on children and their families.

At the end of the event participants should be able to:

- Define emotional abuse and neglect
- Describe factors in relation to the child and parents which might indicate a child is being emotionally abused and neglected
- Describe the short and long term impacts of emotional abuse and neglect on child's development
- Describe the process of assessing emotional abuse and neglect
- Demonstrate awareness of models of intervention and develop strategies for working with children and families affected by emotional abuse and neglect
- Demonstrate increased confidence in supporting children and families affected by emotional abuse and neglect

- Set up and run a 'Give us a break!' group, including assessing the appropriateness of referrals, liaising with parent/carers and using the evaluation materials supplied

- Describe how to seek, obtain, record and review consent
- Describe circumstances where it is necessary to share information without consent
- Respond to consent being refused or withdrawn

- Develop a common understanding of the language of assessment
- Identify the skills necessary to gather and organise data, and the exercising of professional judgement when undertaking assessments
- Gain an understanding of the key concepts of risk and risk assessment
- Demonstrate the link between risk assessment, risk analysis and risk management
- Explore some available assessment tools
- Reflect the need for a general risk assessment framework to sit within the integrated assessment framework
- Promote consideration of risk as part of **all** assessments

- Feel confident in expressing professional judgement
- Evidence decision making in child protection processes
- Gained greater awareness of risk factors which increase risk and impact the assessment process

- Recognise the effects that bullying can have on mental health and well-being and appreciate the journey of recovery

# Safe TALK – ½ day

## Intended audience:

SafeTALK is a half day session aimed at giving participants the skills to recognise that someone may be suicidal and to connect the person to someone with suicide intervention skills. The course is open to staff and public who would like to learn about suicide prevention.

## Course objectives:

Participants learn how to provide practical help to persons with thoughts of suicide in only a few hours. SafeTALK prepares them to be an alert helper. At the end of the event participants should be able to:

- Be aware that opportunities to help a person with thoughts of suicide are sometimes missed, dismissed and avoided
- Recognise when a person might be having thoughts of suicide
- Engage a person with thoughts in direct and open talk about suicide
- Listen to the person's talk about suicide to show that they take the thoughts seriously
- Know the name and contact information of local suicide intervention resources
- Move quickly to connect the person with thoughts to someone trained in suicide intervention
